

## PHYSICAL PLANT OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

The committee has devoted most of its recent efforts to identifying apparent deficiencies in the common areas of Skyline House. First, the committee, together with other residents who volunteered their serivces, have identified, by walk-around in the common areas, items requiring repair/replacement before the building is turned over to the co-owners. The list of apparent deficiencies has been forwarded to the Charles E. Smith Companies. Second, the month of September is being devoted to an engineering study to include structure, plumbing and air conditioning where visible, grounds, parking areas and shrubbery. This study is intended to identify any problems not detected in the walk-around. The study is funded and contracted and is being done by competent, licensed engineers. Any significant deficiencies will become a matter of negotiation with the Charles E. Smith Companies.

Community Relations Committee

The Community Relations Committee is off to a good start. For anyone who isn't sure just what the committee does, let me quote the first paragraph of our proposed charter.

"The Skyline House Community Relations Committee is constituted for the purpose of developing, through its members, the interest and involvement of Skyline House residents in those social and economic issues that affect the Northern Virginia community as a whole and may have an impact on Skyline House property values, or on the comfort and convenience of those living in Skyline House."

Committee members so far include: Carl Brown(1614E), Knox Felter(1506E), Kathleen Jeck(1001W), Martine Longley(609E), Juanita Mayer(713W), Josephine McAdams(1211E), Leslie Silverman(808E), and Helen Wiener(1506W). Ed Stolarum is the Board Liaison. This committee meets the second Tuesday of each month at 8 p.m. in one of the card rooms. The time and place always appears in the newsletter and is posted on the bulletin boards.

At our September meeting the following unfinished business was discussed and/or voted on.

- The committee approved the proposed Community Relations Committee charter and voted that it be submitted to the Board of Directors for approval. (Our thanks to Juanita Mayer for her work on this).
- Helen Wiener was appointed vice-chairperson of this committee.
- 3. Kathleen Jeck gave an updated report on Metro bus service to Skyline House. (see announcement in Newsletter)
- 4. Budget requirements.
- 5. A sub-committee was established (a) to involve new owners as they move into the building, to discuss rules, regulations and organization of the association, and to enlist their participation. (b) to discuss with new renters the organization, functions, and regulations of the association. Josephine McAdams and Leslie Silverman will co-chair this committee.
- 6. Skyline House residents should notify the Board of Elections of their change of address if they plan to vote on November 3.

Under new business the following items were discussed:

- 1. Should Skyline House have a contract with a professional window cleaning organization to clean all inaccessible outside windows?
- 2. Do Skyline residents want an elevated walk-way across South George Mason Drive to the shopping mall?
- 3. What options are available to Skyline House to mitigate the problem of excessive noise on the south side from the Northern Virginia Community College automotive shop?



# GARAGE DOORS

In an effort to minimize costly repairs and prolong the proper operational life of our doors, PLEASE wait until the door (exit or entrance) has completed it's cycle. The doors must completely close before being opened again. Please wait for this cycle.

# NEW KEY SYSTEM

For security reasons the East and West building resident storage rooms and the exercise room door locks were recently replaced with Medeco cylinders. Keys can only be duplicated with an authorized signature (restricted to management).

This was necessary to restrict the continued abuse of the policies established for these facilities by persons who had duplicated keys for their own personal use.

Since only a limited number of keys are now available per room, please remember to return the keys promptly so as not to inconvenience others also wishing to use them.

# GUEST PARKING AND TOWING

The Board of Directors has requested Management to continue to strictly enforce Skyline House's Guest and Handicapped Guest parking rules. The resultant towing has incurred a number of unwarranted verbal abuses to condominium personnel by visitors and residents. In some cases, physical assault has been attempted.

If residents wish to avoid unwanted embarrassment, they should inform their quests of the rules for Guest Parking. On any number of occasions residents have been asked if their guest(s) own a certain vehicle, to which the resident often replies, "no". Later, it is found that the vehicle (which had been towed) did in fact belong to their guest. Observing the posted signs and the Condominium's parking rules is the only way to avoid being towed.

# TRASH DISPOSAL

Management has recently received a number of complaints from concerned residents when finding trash left on the disposal room floors. PLEASE put all trash and garbage DOWN THE CHUTE in the disposal rooms located on each floor. Trash left on the disposal room floors often creates unpleasant odors in the corridor and is a certain invitation to unwanted insects.

Boxes or items too large for the chute cannot be left in the disposal room or service elevator alcove because it is a fire hazard. These items should be taken down to the loading dock by the resident.

As an added thought, please be sure that what you do place into the chute is not so large as to cause a blockage inside the chute. This creates a back-up of trash and a potential fire hazard not to mention, the inconvenience to other residents of the building.





# UNWELCOME VISITORS .....

Unfortunately roaches are not among the endangered species. These pests are one of the world's oldest living life forms having been around for about 300 million years. Scientists say they're the No. 1 candidates to survive a nuclear holocaust.

One pregnant cockroach will present you with your very own colony in less than a week. The tinest bit of soda or beer left in an empty can, or bits of garbage left in the bottom of the garbage disposal is enough to draw one of these pests. So what can we do? The best way to get rid of them is to avoid getting them in the first place. They are attracted by food, garbage and glue, such as that found in book bindings.

It is important not to keep trash or piles of newspapers around. Empty boxes and paper bags from grocery stores is the most common method they use to infiltrate your home.

Skyline House offers at no extra cost to you, professional exterminating service. This service is available on the first and third Monday of each and every month. To insure proper results of treatment, all kitchen cabinets should be emptied of all food stuffs and dishes.

Before there is, or if there is any sign of unwanted pests, enter your name and unit number in the book maintained at the front desk. Please be sure to leave your key and a signed admit slip for entrance with the desk clerk if you will not be at home.

Please remember, whichever method you choose to prevent or eliminate any pest problem, we all have an responsibility to our neighbors, to do our share in preventing an insect problem in our new building.
