## NEW CONSTRUCTION


As if anyone hasn't noticed, full scale operations has begun at One Skyline Tower after about a 30 day lull in activities. The first stage of construction will be the 5-story garage (two floors below ground and three above). Laying of concrete flooring for the garage should begin around September 1. Completion of the building should be in about two years.

For those who are concerned as how do you get from George Mason Drive to the parking lot in the mall, there will be an underground passage between the two points located in the general vicinity of the road that was there.

The building will be built on top of the garage similar to that of Skyline 4,5 and 6. The 26 story tower building will be approximately 342' high from ground level.

The 26-story tower has an unobstructed view of downtown Washington and the Blue Ridge mountains. The outside of the tower will be sparkling glass curtain wall of silver and aluminium, granite base, and contrasting red bands at the building's apex make a remarkable architectural statement. The spectacular 3 story atrium lobby is clad in marble and greenery.

From all indications, One Skyline Tower gives the appearance of a great asset to the Skyline area.

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
