



PHYSICAL PLANT AND OPERATIONS COMMITTEE

Gordon Frank

The Chair opened the first meeting of 1988 by thanking Dave Harvey and Brian Le Bert-Francis for the excellent way they served as Acting Chairs for the November and December 1987 meetings, respectively. Committee business continued uninterrupted for which both received well deserved expressions of appreciation.

In his report, the Chair advised the Committee that the Property Manager is arranging for a presentation on satellite television service by Davis Antenna at the February PPOC. Other actions scheduled for February include recommendations by the Property Manager concerning replacement of hoses, a procurement policy, drainage improvements at the rear of the East Building, Radon testing, and replacement reserves. Also, in accordance with a request by the President of the Association, the Chair has requested that the PPOC be afforded the opportunity to have a member accompany the Charles E. Smith Company representative(s) on each property inspection.

During their patrols, the Neighborhood Watch often notices maintenance items that need attention such as burned out light bulbs, worn paint, etc. Although reported to the Resident Manager, not all items are corrected promptly. The Committee adopted a suggestion that copies of reports of needed maintenance be forwarded to the PPOC Chair, who could then follow-up on their disposition. The Chair also agreed to recommend reinstituting the use of a "Complaint Form" - retitled perhaps - which could be used to notify the Resident Manager of needed maintenance actions with a copy to the Chair, PPOC for follow-up.

The PPOC, concerned with continuing deterioration of the property, moved that the Chair request from the Association's attorney a formal response to the letter that appeared in the January <u>House Special</u>. The Chair was instructed to forward the letter with any additional appropriate remarks and to publish the attorney's reply if publication would not jeopardize the Association's warranty claims.

The final item on the agenda was a presentation by Mr. Michael L. Rodgers, Mechanical Specialist from Charles E. Smith Management, Inc. Mr. Rodgers discussed with the PPOC the alternatives available to lessen the noise, pollution and unsightly appearance of the emergency generators. Available alternatives are replacement with quieter machinery, relocation, or modification. All of the solutions would present additional problems and none would be inexpensive. Considerable analysis would be needed before a specific recommendation and accompanying cost data could be offered. The PPOC plans to request the matter be pursued.

We feel these meetings are important to all of us who consider Fairfax County our home. We invite all interested residents who would like to become part of making this a better community through your committee-please contact the CRC chairperson. Each of us can make a difference.

On Tuesday, January 12th we held a "tax program" in the East Party Room before an audience of 47



persons. Those in attendance, were once again treated to an excellent preview by Ms. Sherry Loop of what is in store for us with the new tax form. Yes, lots of problems, and the thought was brought forth that every Congress person should be made to personally fill out their own tax form. Let them experience what all of us have to go through, cost-wise and time-wise.

I feel I must pass on one complaint about the Tax Seminar evening. The number of folks, who, for whatever reason, felt they had to leave before the program had come to an end. There were too many and it was most disconcerting to the speaker. Please think about this when attending future programs. Thar'you.

There will be no programs during the month of February. However, we are working on a late March program on the subject of investments. This will be an important program for many of us because of the state of our economy and what has been going on since October 19th. Stay tuned.

There were four move ins during the month of December and five tours were given. Here is a breakdown for the entire calendar year of 1987: 111 move ins; 37 tours.

SECURITY AND SAFETY COMMITTEE Rob Sherrer

The Security and Safety Committee met on January 12; seven residents attended. Items discussed and other security related matters include:

The newly begun Sting Security guard service has, with a few exceptions, been performing well. Management has reported that the response of Sting supervisors to particular requests or safety concerns brought to their attention has been quick and effective.

Some of the recent acts vandalism may have been the result of children using pent-up energy; others appear to have been of malicious, destructive obvious intent. In any case, the results are the same. Fortunately, these incidents appear to have abated. Nevertheless, residents are asked to keep watch for vandals incidents of vandalism and report any occurrences to indentifying the management, perpetrators if possible.

A few residents are not adhering to the newly established security measure of using their keys to let door themselves in at the front whenever the doorman is not on duty. In fact, some residents seem to <u>expect</u> that the them in. clerks buzz contradicts the standing the clerks directives to operating the front distracts the clerks from their duties, and serves to undermine the whole policy. The residents not now abiding by this policy are asked to begin doing so as a measure to enhance security of our buildings.

Observations during mid-January snowy/icy driving conditions indicated that drivers Skyline House roadways using appropriate caution on the slippery surfaces and were being attentive to the presence pedestrians who shared the same path. Such caution is especially necessary when rounding corners or pulling out of parking spaces. Residents are urged to continue their safe driving practices.

As stated in last month's "House Special," the Board has appointed Ed Berman, Carroll Thompson, Rob Sherrer as an ad hoc force to review and recommend whether to install a fence or other barrier between Skyline House West and NVCC and between SH Build America. Recommendations will be based security beautification/appearance, cost. Residents are invited to their ideas and recommendations.

The S&C Committee is working with management in specifying final plans and evaluating bids upgrading exterior lighting behind the West and East buildings.



COVENANTS COMMITTEE Howie McClennan, Chairman

The Covenants Committee met on January 21 with 10 persons present.

The Chairman provided an elections update, noting that about a dozen residents had responded to notices asking for volunteers to work the evening of the elections. Unfortunately, however, there still no candidates for the three positions on the Board. Furthermore, no one has agreed to the Elections Committee. The Covenants Chair is working with Management closely preparations for the elections, although materials cannot be sent to the printers until there some candidates.



The Committee discussed complaints previous month filed the violations of the House Rules Regulations. They included noise from a unit above, an unauthorized move-out on a weekend, parking the loading zone, and rudeness toward an owner and quest on all cases, part of staff. Ιn followed up the Management complaint, writing or talking the persons involved.

No motions or recommendations were made by the Committee.

The next Committee meeting will be Thursday, February 11.




