#### O NOTICE

Over 20% of our unit owners have signed up for the option of AUTOMATICALLY deducting their monthly condominium fees from their bank accounts. The first deduction will be run January 3, 1995. Any other unit owner wishing to sign up for this program is encouraged to do so as soon as possible. Deductions for the next group will commence in February of 1995. Those enrolled in this program did NOT receive coupon books this year, otherwise you should have received them. You can obtain duplicate coupon books, if necessary, from the Accounting Department.

#### RULE REMINDERS

#### RULE 16 <u>DECORATIONS</u>

A. Seasonal decorations are permitted on unit doors and balconies during the period December 1st - January 15th.

The Xmas tree dumpster is now located behind the West Loading Dock. It will be in place until January 20th. All trees should be placed in this container and not left in loading docks, etc. If you need assistance please call the office to make arrangements during normal working hours. All trees should be covered while they are being taken to the dumpster.

#### Redecoration

As of the last week of December the redecoration was proceeding well, the 17th, 16th 15th, 14th and 11th floors have had all wallpaper stripped. The 11th, 17th, 16th and 15th have been painted and the unit doors have been painted on the 11th, 17th and 16th floors. A sample light fixture has been installed on the 11th floor and the other samples are planned to be installed this week. Carpeting and wallpaper orders are being finalized. We will publish the schedule as soon as the factories advise us.

The installation of a safety railing along the stairs located at the West end of the West building has been accomplished. The new deck covering inside the East Bridgeway as well as the repair of the Exercise Room roof is scheduled for the 1st week of January '95. Plans for the new fence along the Build America/Skyline House boundary are being finalized. Additionally, we expect a replacement Hornbeam tree to be planted in the area between the East bridgeway and the garage.



The National Capital Area Council, Boy Scouts of America, has awarded the Certificate of Merit to Cub Scout Chris Chang of Falls Church for his action in securing medical assistance for a man suffering a serious medical problem.

On February 18, 1994, Chris' father, Patrick Chang, while talking on the telephone to a friend noticed that the individual was taking an inordinate time in responding and was incoherent. Sensing that the individual was ill, Mr. Chang called his son, Chris, to talk with the gentleman and maintain contact while he went to a neighbor's home to call for the rescue squad. Chris continued to keep the man talking while help was on the way. The ill man suffered from a hypoglycemia attack and eventually became unconscious. Through the efforts of Chris and his father, the victim received timely medical assistance which prevented a more serious medical situation.

Chris, who is the son of Mr. Patrick Chang of 3713 South George Mason Drive in Falls Church, is a member of Cub Scout Pack 615 sponsored by the Fairlington Methodist Church in Alexandria.

## Cultural Center Planned "Right Next Door"

Groundbreaking for the Arlington/Alexandria Cultural Center is planned for Spring 1995, with completion expected by Fall 1996. It will be built on the campus of Northern Virginia Community College, at the intersection of North Beauregard and Braddock in front of the Tyler Building.

The 60,000 square-foot center will house a 1,000 seat, state-of-the-art performance hall complete with orchestra pit and green room; a forum\presentation area; art exhibit space; four meeting rooms; a warming kitchen; an "arts incubator" area; and administrative offices.

Because state policy forbids use of state funds to build non-academic facilities at Virginia's community colleges, private contributions are needed to build the center. Of the \$7.2 million required, more than \$5 million has already been raised. All gifts are tax deductible to the fullest extent provided by law.
