#### **COVENANTS COMMITTEE**

#### Jack Herzig, Chair

At the November meeting, the Committee asked Mr. Don Fenton to compile a list of owners who are ready to sit as members of the Hearings Subcommittee. This is the representative body of the Board of Directors to hear and recommend action in those instances where owners and residents have committed repeated or serious violations of our Skyline House rules. Owners who wish to assist in seeing that the rights of the residents are maintained are requested to so by notifying Mr. Fenton.

Earlier in November this subcommittee had taken action against some owners, resulting in assessments of several hundred dollars for repeated violations of House regulations.

In this regard, a recent U.S. Census Bureau survey showed that the largest percentage of complaints registered by more than 96,000 American households was against the practices of their neighbors. We should take a hint in how we act in our own home, Skyline House.

The Committee reviewed the Management report showing numbers and types of violations of House regulations that had been reported during the previous two-month period. Tailgating was the most frequently reported incident, followed by reports of excess speed in the garage. The Committee discussed a definition of tailgating

that starts out "To drive dangerously close behind another vehicle." It was noted that this practice poses particular danger in the Skyline House garage with its many blind turns, lack of space to maneuver around vehicles, and the ever-present danger of a gasoline fire from an accident spreading among our closely-parked cars. This subject will be discussed further by the Committee chairman, vice chairman, and General Manager with a view toward developing corrective measures before the next scheduled Committee meeting in January.

The Committee endorsed the General Manager's proposed recommendation to the Board that House regulations be changed to require that all residential and commercial unit doors to halls and corridors be kept closed, except when used, of course. Skyline Management offices are exempt due to the nature of their operations.

Committee vice chairman David Kafka and Mr. Fenton plan to confer shortly about a possible need to review and update House rules.

The chairman thanked Committee members and two Board members, Gabrielle Mallon and Dolores Littles, for their participation.



#### Management Report

Status of Resident Corridor Redecoration. As you read this the redecoration has finally been completed. We found a major difference between the colors of the end caps and main portion. The factory has replaced both parts at no cost so that the color will be compatible. In addition we have \$10,000 negotiated а credit from manufacturer because of the difficulties in this contract. All other phases including painting, wallpaper, and lighting have been completed. The "G" level connector has been repainted and carpeted as well as installing a chair rail to minimize damage by our equipment. Management has been receiving many positive comments about the new "look".

**Exercise Room.** The exercise room should be reopened after its face lifting sometime this week Not only was a new ceiling installed but all walls were redone along with carpeting. Shortly, we will be replacing the steam generator for the steam room. Recommendations for a new treadmill will be made at the January '96 meeting.

Emergency Panel Glass. We are experiencing a rash of breakage f the glass in the Fire Phone panels -- over 14 panels in the past 8 days. This breakage is primarily in the West Building. Various measures are being taken to apprehend the person(s) responsible and when found will be prosecuted. Any help by residents will be appreciated. It is important that we have prompt reports so as to narrow down the time of the vandalism.

**Decorations** -- You are reminded the seasonal decorations are permitted on unit doors and balconies during the period December 1 thru January 15.

# FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Financial Management Committee (FMC) met at a special meeting on November 2, 1995 to review Management's proposed 1996 budget. The proposed budget has been evaluated by the FMC Budget Subcommittee, chaired by Ed Bisgyer, and the results submitted to the full committee for review. After discussing the proposed expenditures of several items the FMC voted unanimously to submit the proposed budget as recommended by the subcommittee to the board of directors for approval.

Funds are included in the proposed budget to cover the swimming pool improvements recommended by the PPOC Swimming Pool Subcommittee. Continuing improvements as recommended will be considered during the 1997 and 1998 budget review.

The FMC will commence preparation of a five year budget forecast within the next two months. This project will be a coordinated effort between FMC, PPOC and Management. The FMC will be the lead on this project with Ed Bisgyer being the FMC representative.

The next meeting of the FMC will be held in the East Card Room on January 18, 1996 at 7:00 P.M.

#### CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY

- The following safety precautions should be observed for displaying your Christmas tree:
- 1. Electric lights should not be used on a metal tree. Illumination should be only by spot or reflective lights.
- 2. If the artificial tree is other than metal, it should be noncombustible. Only a tree displaying a "UL" or "FM" label should be used. This noncombustible requirement is applicable to the entire tree (branches, trunk, and trunk wrapping.)
- 3. Some artificial trees can be decorated with miniature lights. However, the tree manufacturer's instructions should be followed precisely. Miniature lights should also display a

"UL" or "FM" label.

- 4. The location of the tree should not block or retstrict the use of halls, exits or stairways.
- 5. The tree should **not** be located near a heat source (ie: a radiator or heat vent, which can cause a more rapid drying of the tree.)
- 6. No open flames like candles should be permitted in the area.
- 7. Finally, **don't** spray arificial snow or glass wool on the needles on the tree. The artificial snow <u>is not fireproof</u>, neither is the glass wool, so you're doing a *crazy* stunt just for the effort. It's not worth it!!

Save your **\$\$\$\$** and buy a better tree or some new lights.


